

## PEOPLE AND OCCUPATIONS IN PORT GIBSON, 1860

The following list of adults resident in Port Gibson in 1860 according to the Eighth Census, affords a fairly adequate view of age levels, sex, place of birth, occupations, slave holding, and property valuation of free persons gainfully employed. The population of Port Gibson in that year was 1,452: white, 895; slaves, 534; free colored, 23. Of the white population, 335 (37.4%) gave an occupation to the census taker, while nearly one-half of the free colored did so. An absolutely accurate occupational census would require consideration of slave occupations, but that information is not available. While the total slave population was only 534, there are 645 listed here. The discrepancy is caused by listing 188 slaves for J. B. Thrasher, while actually only 6 of them were in Port Gibson; nor were all of L. N. Baldwin's 81 slaves kept in town. Allowing six town slaves for each of these men reduces the total by 257, leaving only 388. That figure falls short of the census total by 146, but the rest are to be found among householders for whom no occupation is given in the census, and so are not included in this compilation. It should be noted, also, that the alphabetical listing by occupational groups frequently breaks up family units. For example, William Smith and his three sons, William, Jr., Jessie, and D. Smith worked together in cutting and laying stone.

A few comments may be made by way of interpretation. It is striking that there were so few persons over 50 listed by occupation. The clerical group could be expected to be composed largely of young men, and only 5 (15.1%) of the 33 were 40 years of age or over. Of the 47 engaged in commerce and trade for whom ages were given, 18 (38.3%) were 40 or over. In the professional group, 15 (27.3%) of 55 were 40 or over; and in trades and handicrafts, 27 (20.6%) of 131

were in that category. It is also noteworthy that only 62 (18.5%) of the 335 whites gainfully employed were natives of Mississippi, particularly since Claiborne County lies within the region of early settlement. Of the 62 native Mississippians, nearly one-fourth were young men employed as clerks. Immigrants, from other states and foreign countries, almost completely dominated the business and professional life of ante-bellum Port Gibson. More than one-half of those engaged in commerce and trade were European immigrants, and only two were Mississippians. An examination of the other groups reveals a comparable situation. The people of Port Gibson apparently were fairly well endowed with property, real and personal, although allowance should be made for slaves. There were 45 employed persons who confessed to owning property worth \$10,000 or more, and this number would be increased considerably by adding widows and retired planters, business men, and others. A more complete analysis will reveal other facts of interest, but the compiler's principal purpose is to provide some assistance to local genealogists and not to pose as a sociologist. The data were obtained from the original returns of the Eighth Census, National Archives, Washington, D. C.
